2003: The Power of Professionalism

This annual event was originally organized in 1952 as "National Secretaries Week" by the National Secretaries Association (now IAAP). It was established as an effort to recognize secretaries for their contributions in the workplace, and to attract people to administrative careers. In the year 2000, IAAP announced the name changes to Administrative Professionals Week and Administrative Professionals Day to keep pace with changing job titles and expanding responsibilities of today's administrative workforce.

Many chapters of IAAP will conduct special activities in their communities, including:

- Workshops and seminars on various topics, including management skills for the administrative professional
- Networking events and/or special breakfasts/luncheons
- Presentations of "Administrative Professional of the Year" awards
- Co-sponsored events between IAAP chapters, educational institutions, and other business organizations; and
- Proclamation signings by county and city government officials.

Today, there are more than 3.9 million secretaries and administrative assistants working in the United States, according to US Department of Labor statistics, and 8.9 million people working in various administrative support roles. In Canada, there are 500,000 administrative professionals, which includes 402,600 secretaries, 11,900 executive assistants, and 94,000 clerical supervisors. Millions more work in offices all over the world.

Since that time, 60, 657 individuals have passed the exam and have been allowed to add "CPS" after their name. In May of 2001, the Certified Administrative Professional exam began being offered. Since that time, 1,401 individuals have passed the exam to include "CAP" after the "CPS" in their name.

RECERTIFICATION HIGHLIGHTED

The Institute for Certification has recently sent out information updating the re-certification process. It stresses the importance of certification to any administrative professional—it is indeed a very prestigious designation offered to us.

On January 1, 1998 the mandatory recertification program was started. It was an important step, as an administrative professional must maintain their professional competency throughout their career; not just at the beginning of their certification. Members certifying after the 1998 date could risk being placed on an inactive list. Effective in January 2003, all certificates will be dated, showing the five-year period of their validation. All CPS and CAP holders will receive a letter one year prior to their recertification is due. Failure to comply with recertification requirements will now require individuals to reapply and retest to regain active certification.
